 - 2. God's ongoing creative work, Acts 9:15; Psalms 139:13&16; Jeremiah 1:4-5 & 27:6.
 - 3. Jesus' different view of people, Luke 19:6-7.
 - B. Have faith in people's Creator.
 - 1. Paul's confidence in the Creator produced confidence in people, 1 Corinthians 1:8; 2 Corinthians 1:7 & 21; Philippians 1:6; 1 Thessalonians 5:23-24; 2 Thessalonians 3:3.
 - 2. Attention on people brings discouragement; attention on God brings hope.
 - 3. When people don't deserve confidence, pray—turn attention to Creator, Luke 22:31-32; Romans 1:9-10; Philippians 1:4; Colossians 1:9; 2 Thessalonians 1:11.
 - C. Be like their Creator patiently expect the best from people.
 - 1. Jesus speaks His faith in Peter, Luke 22:32.
 - 2. Jesus' persistent patience, John 21:19.
