- I. "I have chosen one of [Jesse's] sons to be king," 1 Samuel16:1.
 - A. "He is tending the sheep," 1Samuel 16:11.
 - B. "He was ruddy with a fine appearance and handsome features," 1 Samuel 16:12.
- II. The pleasant season begins, 1 Samuel 16:13.
- III. An unpleasant season sets in, 1 Samuel 18:6-9.
- IV. David survives the unpleasant season, 2 Samuel 5:3.
- V. Surviving the unpleasant seasons of life.
 - A. Trust the Designer of seasons.
 - 1. When life went from pleasant to unpleasant, David didn't blame himself.
 - 2. He trusted the Creator of seasons, Genesis 1:14.
 - 3. Life changes because seasons change.
 - 4. He accepted seasons as normal events, Psalm 1:3; Ecclesiastes 3:1.
 - a. Jesus accepts the seasons of life, Luke 19:28, 37-38 with Luke 23:21.
 - b. David didn't make himself more miserable by ruthless introspection.
 - 5. Instead of looking inward, look upward, Psalm 57:2; 138:8.
 - a. God uses unpleasant seasons to prepare us for something better, 2 Samuel 5:3.
 - b. God designed that unpleasant seasons lead into seasons of abundance, Psalm 66:10-12.
 - B. Remember that all unpleasant seasons will end, Psalm 57:1; Hebrews 12:2.
 - 1. Seasons begin and **must** end.
 - Refuse despair when unpleasant seasons drag on and on, 1 Samuel 27:1; 2 Corinthians 4:8; Psalm 9:18; Proverbs 23:17, 18.
 - 3. Tightly grasp your sheltering refuge, Psalm 57:1.
- VI. Surviving the unpleasant season makes you a bigger blessing than you ever dreamed, Luke 1:32.
