- I. "The...eastern peoples invaded the country," Judges 6:3.
  - A. They... ruined the crops...& did not spare a living thing for Israel...." Judges 6:4.
  - B. "They invaded the land to ravage it. Median... impoverished the Israelites," Judges 6:5-6.
- II. Gideon appointed as Israel's military leader, Judges 6:14.
- III. Gideon looses peace of mind, Judges 6:17.
- IV. God's commitment to your peace of mind.
  - A. The questioning mind,
    - 1. Questions about everything swirled through Gideon's mind: His qualifications, his abilities, God's love, God's commitment to His people.
    - 2. God's reaction? A miracle & a message, Judges 6:21,23.
    - 3. Gideon's new realization, Judges 6;24. ("God loves me less," Isaiah 41:9.)
  - B. The doubting mind, Judges 6:36-40.
    - 1. When victory looked impossible, doubts crowded into Gideon's mind.
    - 2. Gideon requested divine reassurance.
    - 3. God's response? Un-mistakable re-assurance, 1 Kings 18:38-39.
    - 4. The prefix 're' means 'again, anew.'
    - 5. Jesus re-assurance for doubting Christians, John 14:1,27; Matthew 6:31-32; 14:30-31; Luke 12:32; Jeremiah 29:11.
  - C. The fearful mind, Judges 7:9-15.
    - 1. When the time for acting upon God's command arrived, un- spoken fears showed up.
    - 2. God com-passionately responds to Gideon's unspoken fears, Judges 7:10-11. ('Explanations or promises?')
- V. The effect of God's commitment to your peace of mind, Judges 7:15.
  - A. Praise from the heart
  - B. Courage to face life.

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
