The Miracle of Jesus' Conception Luke 1:31, 34-35, 37

- I. "You will be with child and give birth to a son," Luke 1:31.
- II. "How will this be since I am a virgin?" Luke 1:34.
- III. "The Holy Spirit will come upon you and the power of the most high will overshadow you," Luke 1:35.
- IV. "So the Holy One to be born will be called the Son of God," Luke 1:35.
- V. The miracle of Jesus' conception.
 - A. Infinite God put on human smallness.
 - 1. The person we call God fills the vast universe, 1Kings 8:27; Jeremiah 23:24.
 - 2. He cannot be measured; is without limit.
 - 3. At the moment of conception, the measureless Spirit of Christ became microscopic, Philippians 2:6-7.
 - 4. The Holy Spirit enveloped Mary and united the microscopic Christ with the human cell. God became a two cell human, Luke 1:35, 37.
 - 5. This child inherited humanity from Mary and divinity from God the Father, Luke 1:35; Romans 1:3.
 - B. Self-sufficient God put on human needs.
 - 1. Eternal God provides for His own needs.
 - 2. But conception made God totally dependent on a human mother and a stepfather, Luke 2:7; Matthew 2:13-14, 19-20; Luke 19:30-31.
 - C. Ever-living God put on human vulnerability.
 - 1. In eternity past God enjoyed immortality.
 - 2. Humanity made God vulnerable capable of being wounded, open to damage.
 - 3. The vulnerable Jesus lived under constant threat, Matthew 2:13; John 8:59, 12:36.
- VI. "Though He was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you through His poverty might become rich," 2 Corinthians 8:9.

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
