 1. Nobody likes suffering but life on earth inevitably brings it, Psalms 34:19; John 16:33.
 2. Causes of suffering: People's mistakes, persecution for Jesus' sake, living in a sinful world.
 3. Regardless of the cause, Jesus predicts your victory over suffering, Luke 10:19; Isaiah 41:10; Proverbs 12:21.
 - a. Never promised pain-free suffering.
 - b. Promised that Christlike endurance of suffering will deepen our relationship with Him, 2 Corinthians 12:9.
 4. Paul's victory? Allowed suffering to tear away everything that interfered with loving Jesus, 2 Corinthians 12:10; Philippians 3:10.
