    1. Attempts to find explanations place great emotional stress upon us, Psalm 73:16; 139:6.
    2. God disregards Naomi’s accusations, John 16:32; Matthew 27:46.
    3. He surrounds us with His love, Psalm 32:10; Isaiah 30:18.
    4. He patiently allows time for healing.
  - B. Give up your search for sensible explanations.
    1. Naomi searched for explanations that fit into her limited understanding.
    2. A Creator of unlimited understanding controlled her life, Isaiah 40:28; Psalm 145:3; 147:5.
    3. Admit the futility of your search and rest in God’s understanding Proverbs 20:24; Jeremiah 10:23
  - C. God is working in your behalf.
    1. ‘God has forsaken me,’ Naomi reasoned.
    2. God promises victory to the disappointed, Isaiah 49:23; 64:4.
